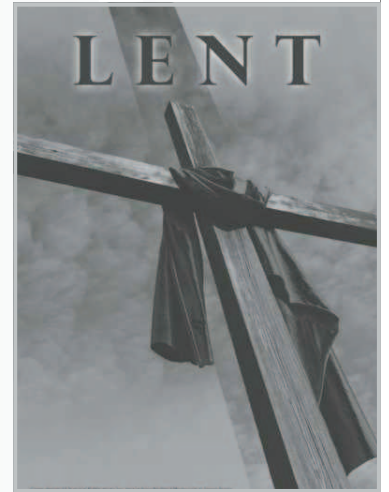

Ash Wednesday

The readings for Ash Wednesday speak about conversion. This conversion deals with life and death. In the gospel, Jesus points beyond behaviors to a conversion of heart, as was also commanded by Joel in the first reading “return to me with your whole heart”. Mere self denial is not the goal of lent; renewed relationship with God and each other is. This kind of conversion demands of us a unique self-giving - a forgetting about ourselves which places God at the center of our lives.

Behaviors are important, to be sure, changed behaviors and habits are also a goal of Lent and often witness to a conversion of heart. But changed behaviors are worthless if they don't lead to and express something deeper: that conversion of heart which brings us closer to God and each other. Lent is an opportunity to change behaviors and come to conversion in both communal and individual ways. In either case, we surrender ourselves to God and seek mercy and forgiveness.

The size or difficulty or quantity of our penance during Lent isn't the measure of a successful Lent; conversion of heart is. During Lent, we practice dying to self in new ways which brings us to a true celebration of Easter life. It's better to accomplish something small which makes a difference in our relationships with God and others than to tackle something large which may bring failure. The choice is ours.

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time **Reflection**

It's astonishing to some people that we Catholics will spend time talking to a priest about our deepest faults. Confession of sins and being assured of God's forgiveness is not something that everyone readily understands. But when we take the time to really acknowledge our sinfulness, to admit to ourselves, to God, and to another person (the priest) what we have done wrong, we can experience the healing that comes from the confession of our sins.

The Gospel today explicitly reminds us that the forgiveness of sins is connected to healing. When we confess our sins, make an act of contrition, and receive absolution we are healed in that sacrament. The paralyzed man who was dropped through the roof in front of Jesus by his friends had his sins forgiven. Much to the astonishment of the crowd, the paralytic got up, rolled up his mat, and walked out the door. It was that easy.

There is a lot of misconception about the sacrament of penance. Once a person gets over the hurdle of fear or shame though, it really is as easy as the actions of the paralyzed man. There was a lot of work on the part of others to get him in front of Jesus. They had to carry him there, open the roof, and lower him down. And before we go to confession, there is some work we have to do. We have to examine our conscience, and be willing to be honest with ourselves and with God. But after that it's easy. We sit down, tell the priest our sins, receive a penance, pray a prayer of contrition, receive absolution, and then go on our way.

It is the work of reconciliation that takes much longer, sometimes even a lifetime. Because sin fractures relationships, confession really is the easy part. It is what we do afterwards to heal the wounds that is the most demanding. It is a good thing Lent begins on Wednesday!

Lenten Guidelines

Fast & Abstinence Regulations

1. *Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.*
2. *Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.*
3. *On Ash Wed., and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.*
4. *To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.*
5. *Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.*
